## 2010 Book Sales Report

The 22nd Annual Book Sale in October was another great success raising over \$27,000, thanks to our many energetic and loyal volunteers. (A shout-out too to the guys from Bucklers Truck Rentals (2 small men with big hearts) who year after year actually look forward to shifting our thousands of boxes).

When combined with smaller sales across 2010. it was a close-to-record year with over \$39,000 raised. A now regular schedule of smaller sales throughout the year kept our sorting house volunteers and directors busy: Blow-Out Sale (January), Spring Sale (April), 2 summer Outdoor Sales (June & August) & International Literacy Day mini-sale (September). FOL in conjunction with the KGH Auxiliary, are newly conducting 2day book sales for patients, staff and visitors in the Kelowna General Hospital foyer.

#### Wishes do come true!

At the June 2010 FOL Directors meeting, almost \$25,000 in branches wishlist items approved (many have arrived as highlighted on Page 2). FOLs commitment to Summer Reading Club programming increases each year with funding of over \$4000 for crafts, giveaways, prizes & additional guests for our three branches.

Kelowna Friends help fulfil wishes across the Okanagan. 40% of proceeds from our major book sales, go to ORL HQ to help those branches who do not have the benefit of a Friends group to support them & for system-wide projects. The allocation from our Oct 2009-Sep 2010 sales amounted to \$15,689. Lesley Dieno (ORL Executive Director) announced at the 2010 AGM that projects using these funds in 2011 will include 75th anniversary celebrations and over the next 2 years, a new web interface for the ORL online catalogue.


Our book-sorting house is open to accept your donations every Friday 9am to noon (except Friday public holidays & book sale days).
